PROPOSED ACTION ON REGULATIONS

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TITLE 2. FAIR POLITICAL PRACTICES COMMISSION

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Fair Political Practices Commission, pursuant to the authority vested in it by Sections 82011, 87303, and 87304 of the Government Code to review proposed conflict-of-interest codes, will review the proposed/amended conflict-of-interest codes of the following:

CONFLICT-OF-INTEREST CODES

AMENDMENT

STATE AGENCY: California Institute for Regenerative Medicine
Office of Traffic Safety

MULTI-COUNTY: Mojave Desert Air Quality Management District

A written comment period has been established commencing on April 13, 2018, and closing on May 28, 2018. Written comments should be directed to the Fair Political Practices Commission, Attention Sasha Linker, 1102 Q Street, Suite 3000, Sacramento, California 95811.

At the end of the 45-day comment period, the proposed conflict-of-interest code(s) will be submitted to the Commission's Executive Director for her review, unless any interested person or his or her duly authorized representative requests, no later than 15 days prior to the close of the written comment period, a public hearing before the full Commission. If a public hearing is requested, the proposed code(s) will be submitted to the Commission for review.

The Executive Director of the Commission will review the above-referenced conflict-of-interest code(s), proposed pursuant to Government Code Section 87300, which designate, pursuant to Government Code Section 87302, employees who must disclose certain investments, interests in real property and income.

The Executive Director of the Commission, upon her or its own motion or at the request of any interested person, will approve, or revise and approve, or return the

proposed code(s) to the agency for revision and re-submission within 60 days without further notice.

Any interested person may present statements, arguments or comments, in writing to the Executive Director of the Commission, relative to review of the proposed conflict-of-interest code(s). Any written comments must be received no later than May 28, 2018. If a public hearing is to be held, oral comments may be presented to the Commission at the hearing.

COST TO LOCAL AGENCIES

There shall be no reimbursement for any new or increased costs to local government which may result from compliance with these codes because these are not new programs mandated on local agencies by the codes since the requirements described herein were mandated by the Political Reform Act of 1974. Therefore, they are not "costs mandated by the state" as defined in Government Code Section 17514.

EFFECT ON HOUSING COSTS AND BUSINESSES

Compliance with the codes has no potential effect on housing costs or on private persons, businesses or small businesses.

AUTHORITY

Government Code Sections 82011, 87303 and 87304 provide that the Fair Political Practices Commission as the code-reviewing body for the above conflict-of-interest codes shall approve codes as submitted, revise the proposed codes and approve them as revised, or return the proposed codes for revision and re-submission.

REFERENCE

Government Code Sections 87300 and 87306 provide that agencies shall adopt and promulgate conflict-of-interest codes pursuant to the Political Reform Act and amend their codes when change is necessitated by changed circumstances.

TITLE 2. CALIFORNIA PUBLIC EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Board of Administration (the Board) of the California Public Employees' Retirement System (CalPERS) proposes to take the regulatory action described below in the Informative Digest after considering public comments, objections, or recommendations regarding the proposed regulatory action.

I. PROPOSED REGULATORY ACTION

In this filing, the Board proposes to add section 574, "Definition of Full-Time Employment" under Article 4, Chapter 2 of Division 1 of Title 2 of the California Code of Regulations (CCR). By proposing this regulation in this Article, CalPERS seeks to explicitly define "full-time" employment.

II. WRITTEN COMMENT PERIOD

Any interested person may submit written comments relevant to the proposed regulatory action. The written comment period has been established commencing on **April 13, 2018** and closing on **May 28, 2018** at 5:00 p.m. The Regulation Coordinator must receive all written comments by the close of the comment period. III. PUBLIC HEARING

A public hearing will not be scheduled unless an interested person, or his or her duly authorized representative, submits a written request for a public hearing to CalPERS no later than 15 days prior to the close of the written comment period. Notice of the time, date, and place of the hearing will be provided to every person who has filed a request for notice with CalPERS.

IV. ACCESS TO HEARING ROOM

The hearing room will be accessible to persons with mobility impairment, and the room can be made accessible to persons with hearing or visual impairments upon advance request to the CalPERS Regulation Coordinator.

V. AUTHORITY AND REFERENCE

The Board has the authority to take regulatory action under Government Code (GC) sections 20121 and 7522.02(j).

Reference citations: GC sections 20305, 20635, 20635.1, 20636, 20636.1, 20967, and 7522.34.

VI. INFORMATIVE DIGEST/POLICY STATEMENT OVERVIEW

The Public Employees' Retirement Law uses such phrases as "full-time employment," "full-time employees," and "full-time basis" in certain Government Code sections relating to membership eligibility, overtime positions, compensation earnable, and pensionable compensation but does not define "full-time" except as it applies to certain school members in GC section 20636.1. By proposing this regulation, the Board seeks to explicitly define "full-time" employment and set forth related notification and exemption requirements that are applicable to contracting agencies. It is intended to provide clarity and uniformity for CalPERS, its members, contracting agencies, and other stakeholders to ensure consistent use of the term "full-time."

The Board previously set forth the requirements for full-time employment in Board resolutions. Most recently, on October 15, 1980, the Board approved a resolution that allows contracting agencies to set a "normal" work week for full-time employment and to allow the Board to establish a minimum and maximum range that it would consider as full-time employment for system purposes. In the resolution, the Board established 34 hours per calendar week, four working days per calendar week, and nine months per fiscal year as the minimum periods and 60 hours per calendar week and six working days per calendar week as the maximum periods which would be considered as full-time employment for system purposes. The Board resolution further provides that each contracting agency is to inform the Board of the normal work week periods which the contracting agency considers to be full-time and that such periods are to be established for all employees in the same group. If an employee's normal work week falls outside of that range, the Board resolution requires the contracting agency to submit a request to the Board for special consideration.

Currently, for purposes of determining compensation earnable, CalPERS considers work schedules which fall between 34 and 60 hours per week to be full-time employment, except that full-time employment for classified school members is set at 40 hours per week in accordance with GC section 20636.1. Exceptions that fall outside of the 34 to 60 hours per week range have been granted by the Board.

This proposed regulation would clarify CalPERS' definition of "full-time" employment as used in the Public Employees' Retirement Law for purposes of determining CalPERS membership eligibility in accordance with GC section 20305, reporting overtime positions in accordance with GC sections 20635 and 20635.1, determining compensation earnable in accordance with GC sections 20636 and 20636.1, and determining pensionable compensation in accordance with GC section 7522.34. The proposed regulation will maintain the minimum of 34 hours per calendar week, or the equivalent as determined by the Board, and will remove the upper limit of 60 hours per calendar week set by the 1980 Board resolution in order to give contracting agencies more flexibility to determine full-time employment for employees who may have a weekly schedule of greater than 60 hours per calendar week. The proposed regulation will continue to allow contracting agencies to determine what constitutes the normal work week for full-time employment for its employees provided that it is at least 34 hours per calendar week, or the equivalent as determined by the Board. For example, a normal work schedule consisting of sixty-eight hours for two calendar weeks may be determined to be full-time. If the contracting agency's definition of a normal work week for full-time employment is below 34 hours per work week, or the equivalent as determined by the Board, the proposed regulation will require the contracting agency to submit a written request to the Board for an exemption.

This proposed regulation is consistent with existing law. This proposed regulation will require contracting agencies to notify CalPERS of the normal work week periods which are considered full-time and will require that these periods be established for all employees in the same "group or class of employment" within the meaning of the Public Employees' Retirement Law. Currently, contracting agencies already notify CalPERS of what constitutes full-time employment for their normal work week schedules through the payroll reporting process; therefore, no additional reporting will be required from the contracting agencies. The proposed regulation will not apply to the extent it conflicts with a provision in the Public Employees' Retirement Law, such as the provision in GC section 20636.1 that states

that full-time employment for classified school members is 40 hours per week.

Consistency Evaluation

CalPERS has evaluated and determined that the proposed regulations are not inconsistent nor incompatible with existing State regulations. There are no other comparable existing State regulations pursuant to GC Section 11346.5, subdivision (a), paragraph (3)(D).

Anticipated Benefit

CalPERS believes that adoption of this proposed regulation will provide clarity and uniformity for CalPERS, contracting agencies, the State, and CalPERS members to ensure consistent use of the term "full-time." Removing the upper limit of 60 hours per calendar week will allow contracting agencies more autonomy and flexibility in determining what constitutes full-time employment for employees with unique weekly and monthly schedules. The proposed regulation is consistent with the Public Employees' Retirement Law and applicable federal laws, rules, and regulations regarding full-time employment. The regulation is reasonably necessary to clarify CalPERS' interpretation of what is considered "full-time" employment for system purposes.

VII. PRE-NOTICE CONSULTATION WITH THE PUBLIC

The proposed regulation contains clarifying language regarding CalPERS' interpretation of what is considered "full-time" employment for system purposes. Therefore, no pre-notice consultation was done with the public.

VIII. EFFECT ON SMALL BUSINESS

The proposed regulatory action does not affect small business because it applies only to CalPERS-covered contracting agencies and CalPERS members.

IX. DISCLOSURES REGARDING THE PROPOSED REGULATORY ACTION

The Board has made the following initial determinations:

- A. MANDATE ON LOCAL AGENCIES AND SCHOOL DISTRICTS: The proposed regulatory action does not impose any mandates on local agencies and school districts.
- B. COSTS OR SAVINGS TO ANY STATE AGENCY: The proposed regulatory action will not result in any additional costs or savings to any State agency.

- C. **COSTS TO ANY LOCAL AGENCY OR SCHOOL DISTRICT:** The proposed regulatory action will not result in any costs on any local agency or school district.
- D. **NONDISCRETIONARY COSTS OR SAVINGS IMPOSED ON LOCAL AGENCIES:** The proposed regulatory action does not impose any nondiscretionary costs or savings on local agencies.
- E. **COSTS OR SAVINGS IN FEDERAL FUNDING TO THE STATE:** The proposed regulatory action will not result in additional costs or savings in federal funding to the State.
- F. **ADVERSE ECONOMIC IMPACT:** The proposed regulatory action will not have a significant statewide adverse economic impact directly affecting businesses, including the ability of California businesses to compete with businesses in other states. CalPERS relied upon the plain text of the statutes and the proposed regulation to make this determination.
- G. **COST IMPACT ON REPRESENTATIVE PRIVATE PERSONS OR BUSINESSES:** CalPERS is not aware of any cost impacts that a representative private person or business would necessarily incur in reasonable compliance with the proposed regulatory action because the regulatory action only applies to CalPERS, CalPERS-covered contracting agencies, and CalPERS members.
- H. **RESULTS OF THE ECONOMIC IMPACT ANALYSIS:** The proposed regulatory action: (1) will not create or eliminate jobs within California; (2) will not create new businesses or eliminate existing businesses within California; (3) will not affect the expansion of businesses currently doing business within California; and (4) will not adversely impact the health and welfare of California residents because the proposed regulation serves only to provide CalPERS' interpretation of certain terms used in the Public Employees' Retirement Law and the Public Agency and Schools Reference Guide.
- I. **EFFECT ON HOUSING COSTS:** The proposed regulatory action has no effect on housing costs.
- J. **COSTS TO ANY LOCAL AGENCY OR SCHOOL DISTRICT WHICH MUST BE REIMBURSED IN ACCORDANCE WITH GOVERNMENT CODE SECTIONS 17500 THROUGH 17630:** There are no costs to any local agency or school district, which must be reimbursed in accordance with GC sections 17500 through 17630.

X. CONSIDERATION OF ALTERNATIVES

In accordance with GC section 11346.5(a)(13), the Board must determine that no reasonable alternative considered by the Board, or that has otherwise been identified and brought to the attention of the Board, would be:

- more effective in carrying out the purpose of the proposed action,
- as effective as, and less burdensome to affected private persons than the proposed action, or
- more cost-effective to affected private persons and equally effective in implementing the statutory policy or other provision of law.

The Board invites interested persons to present statements or arguments with respect to alternatives to the proposed regulations at the above-mentioned public hearing or during the written comment period.

Project: Hunter and Panther Creek Bridge
Seismic Restoration Project
Location: Del Norte County
Applicant: California Department of
Transportation

Background

The California Department of Transportation (Applicant) proposes to replace two bridges: Hunter Creek Bridge and Panther Creek Bridge, respectively, in order

to provide seismically sound structures that meet current highway design standards. The Hunter and Panther Creek Bridges Seismic Restoration (Project) is located on U.S. Highway 101 between Post Miles 8.2 to 8.7 in southwestern Del Norte County, approximately 18 miles south of Crescent City, California.

The new Hunter Creek Bridge replaces a continuous three-span structure with two piers in the stream channel with a two-span structure with only one pier in the channel. The new Panther Creek Bridge replaces a three-span structure with several piers in Panther Creek Pond with a single-span, steel tied-arch structure without piers in the water.

Prior to commencing construction on Hunter and Panther Creek Bridges, the Applicant will replace the existing redwood log stringer bridge at Waukell Creek with a concrete-surfaced bridge with pre-cast abutments. The Waukell Creek Bridge does not pass high-flow storm events and is currently a partial barrier to fish passage during high-flow events. The bridge has approximately 30 cubic yards of fine soil on its running surface, which is progressively eroding into Waukell Creek. The Department of Fish and Wildlife's Recovery Strategy for California Coho Salmon identifies the Waukell Creek population of coho salmon (*Oncorhynchus kisutch*), Southern Oregon-Northern California Coast evolutionarily significant unit (SONCC coho salmon), as a key population to maintain or improve.

The Project will include up to two seasons of stream diversion and fish capture and relocation; ground disturbance and vegetation clearing; access road construction; temporary detour bridge installation; bridge demolition; utility relocation; pile driving operations including oscillation, vibration or drilling piles; placing embankment fill for minor road widening; and equipment staging.

The Project activities described above are expected to incidentally take¹ SONCC coho salmon where those activities take place within and adjacent to the Project sites. In particular, SONCC coho salmon could be incidentally taken as a result of catching and capturing fish for relocation efforts during stream dewatering for construction activities, stress or injury sustained during capture and relocation efforts, desiccation, being crushed during stream dewatering activities, or project noise impacts such as impact pile driving. SONCC coho salmon are designated as a threatened species pursuant

to both the federal Endangered Species Act (ESA) (16 U.S.C. § 1531 et seq.) and the California Endangered Species Act (CESA) (Fish & G. Code, § 2050 et seq.). (See Cal. Code Regs., tit. 14, § 670.5, subd. (b)(2)(D).)

SONCC coho salmon have been documented as present at the Project site and there is occupied or suitable SONCC coho salmon habitat within and adjacent to the Project site. Because of the proximity of the nearest documented SONCC coho salmon, dispersal patterns of SONCC coho salmon, and the presence of suitable SONCC coho salmon habitat within the Project site, the National Marine Fisheries Service (Service) determined that SONCC coho salmon are reasonably certain to occur within the Project site and that Project activities are expected to result in the incidental take of SONCC coho salmon.

According to the National Marine Fisheries Service (Service), the Project will result in the temporary and permanent loss of 0.63 acres of aquatic and wetland habitat (0.03 acres is considered permanent loss), and 0.95 acres of upland riparian habitat (0.08 is considered permanent loss), for total of 1.58 acres of temporary and permanent habitat loss. Construction of the Project will also result in the temporary loss of 130 linear feet (0.14 acres) of aquatic SONCC coho salmon habitat in Hunter Creek over two work seasons from stream diversion.

The Service determined that take of juvenile SONCC coho salmon in the form of capture is expected during fish relocation and diversion activities at the Project Site. Up to 24 juvenile SONCC coho salmon are expected to be captured and relocated over the course of the Project (i.e., two years). The Service also determined that mortality resulting from electrofishing is estimated to be about three percent; one mortality is expected over the course of two construction seasons.

Because the Project is expected to result in take of a species designated as threatened under the federal ESA, Applicant, as a Federal Highway Administration agent, consulted with the Service as required by the ESA. On January 30, 2018, the Service issued a biological opinion (Service file No. WCR-2017-8344) (BO) to the Applicant. The BO describes the Project, requires the Applicant to comply with terms of the BO and its incidental take statement (ITS), and incorporates additional measures. The BO also requires the Applicant to implement and adhere to measures contained within the biological assessment (BA) and Essential Fish Habitat Assessment.

On February 27, 2018, the Director of the Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) received a notice from the Applicant requesting a determination pursuant to Fish and Game Code section 2080.1 that the BO, the ITS, and the BA are consistent with CESA for purposes

of the Project and SONCC coho salmon. (Cal. Reg. Notice Register 2018, No. 11-Z, p. 456.)

Determination

CDFW has determined that the ITS and associated BO are consistent with CESA as to the Project and SONCC coho salmon because the mitigation measures contained in the ITS, its associated BO, and conditions in the BA meet the conditions set forth in Fish and Game Code section 2081, subdivisions (b) and (c), for authorizing incidental take of CESA-listed species. Specifically, CDFW finds that: (1) take of SONCC coho salmon will be incidental to an otherwise lawful activity; (2) the mitigation measures identified in the BO, ITS and BA will minimize and fully mitigate the impacts of the authorized take, and in particular, these measures are roughly proportional in extent to the authorized taking and are capable of successful implementation; (3) adequate funding is ensured to implement the required avoidance, minimization, and mitigation measures and to monitor compliance with and effectiveness of those measures; and (4) the Project will not jeopardize the continued existence of SONCC coho salmon. The mitigation measures in the BO, ITS, and BA include but are not limited to, the following:

Avoidance, Minimization, and Mitigation Measures

- To fully mitigate for the incidental take (mortality) of juvenile SONCC coho salmon due to temporary stream diversion and fish capture and relocation, Applicant will remove a failing log-stringer type bridge on Waukell Creek and replace it with a single span concrete-top bridge capable of passing a 100-year storm event including debris and large woody material by October 15, 2018, and prior to beginning construction on Hunter or Panther Bridges.
- A qualified biologist will monitor all Project in-stream construction activities and be present during dewatering activities, drilling for bridge foundations, concrete pours, and bridge demolition to ensure adherence to all environmental permit conditions and measures.
- Applicant shall minimize exposure and mortality of listed SONCC coho salmon during fish relocation activities by preparing and submitting a Construction Site Dewatering/Diversion Plan (Dewatering Plan) to the Service for approval prior to implementation.
- The Dewatering Plan shall include SONCC coho salmon relocation specifications, require seining of fish prior to electrofishing, compliance with Guidelines for Electrofishing Waters Containing Salmonids Listed under the Endangered Species Act (NMFS 2000) and limit electrofishing to only

qualified individuals with appropriate training and experience in electrofishing techniques.

- Applicant shall prepare a hydroacoustic monitoring plan prior to construction that addresses the frequency of monitoring, positions that hydrophones would be deployed, techniques for gathering and analyzing acoustic data, quality control measures, and reporting activities.
- Applicant shall ensure the Hunter Creek diversion will be of sufficient length to avoid hydroacoustic impacts to fish from pile driving activities associated with construction of the bridge foundation.
- Applicant will notify the Service within 24 hours of meeting or exceeding take of SONCC coho salmon prior to project completion or if methods used during Project implementation differ from those proposed and analyzed.
- Applicant shall brief contractors at pre-construction meetings on environmental permit conditions and requirements relative to each stage of the proposed project, including work windows and construction site management.
- The in-stream construction work window and dewatering of the stream channel shall be limited to the low-flow season between June 15 and October 15 annually.

Monitoring and Reporting Measures

- Applicant shall prepare and submit to the Service by December 31 of each season during which fish relocation occurs a report documenting the number and species of individuals captured, time spent seining and electrofishing, the amount of time captured fish spent out of the stream, the location where fish were released, and any mortalities or injuries observed during relocation activities. This report shall include a brief narrative of the circumstances surrounding SONCC coho salmon mortalities and photographs of the removal site, fish captured, and the release site. Although not a condition of the BO, CDFW requests a copy of the written monitoring reports as well.

The proposed project will occur on a section of the pipeline between the Santa Maria Airport and W. Foster Rd. in Santa Barbara County.

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) issued an Incidental Take Permit (Service Permit No. TE52396C-0) and Habitat Conservation Plan (HCP) to Phillips 66 Pipeline, LLC on December 15, 2017, which considered the effects of the proposed project on state threatened and federally endangered California tiger salamander (*Ambystoma californiense*).

Pursuant to California Fish and Game Code section 2080.1, Phillips 66 Pipeline, LLC is requesting a determination that the ITP and its associated HCP are consistent with CESA for purposes of the proposed project. The proposed project involves manual removal of European sea lavender (*Limonium durisusculum*) using hand tools, e.g. small gardening trowels and shovels, solarization, and if necessary, application of approved herbicides, e.g. Telar and Polaris. Herbicide treatment will be a last resort and only with the oversight of and prior approval from the UC Natural Reserve System. The proposed project will be carried out on the Carpinteria salt marsh, Santa Barbara County, California.

The Regional Water Board issued a Notice of Applicability (WDID No. 34217WQ43) for coverage under the General 401 Order on December 15, 2017.

The University of California Santa Barbara Natural Reserve System is requesting a determination that the project and associated documents are complete pursuant to Fish and Game Code section 1653 subdivision (d).
