Re: (1) 2025 Rulemaking Calendar and Legislative Reporting Requirements, Including E-Mail Address To Submit Calendars; (2) Format to Submit Calendars; (3) Annual Mailing List Update; and (4) Request to be Added to Your Mailing List

We would like to take this opportunity to remind you that Government Code section 11017.6 requires every state agency responsible for implementing a statute that requires interpretation pursuant to the Administrative Procedure Act to prepare, by January 30, a rulemaking calendar for that year. The rulemaking calendar must be (1) prepared in accordance with the format specified by the Office of Administrative Law (OAL), (2) approved by the head of the department or, if the rulemaking agency is an entity other than a department, by the officer, board, commission, or other entity which has been delegated the authority to adopt, amend, or repeal regulations, and (3) published in the California Regulatory Notice Register (Notice Register). (Government Code, section 11017.6.)

<u>Schedule A and Schedule B Forms</u>. OAL is enclosing two forms for state agencies to use when providing the information required by Government Code section 11017.6. Schedule A is for proposed regulations implementing statutes enacted during 2024. Schedule B is for proposed regulations implementing statutes enacted prior to 2024. These forms can also be downloaded from our website at <a href="https://oal.ca.gov/publications/rulemaking\_calendar/">https://oal.ca.gov/publications/rulemaking\_calendar/</a>.

Format for Submitting Rulemaking Calendars. Please e-mail your Rulemaking Calendars to us in Microsoft Word format. We are planning to post the Rulemaking Calendar on our website, and for purposes of ADA website remediation, we request that the Calendars be submitted in Word format, not in PDF format. After our remediation, we will convert the Calendar to pdf format.

For multiple reporting of rulemakings, please copy the required group of information fields and paste subsequent rulemakings one after the other in the same document.

Also, please be aware that Government Code sections 11017.5 and 11017.6(b) contain other requirements for state agencies to submit certain information to the Legislature when implementing new programs or statutes. Each year, OAL compiles all of the individual agency rulemaking calendars into one calendar for

publication and distribution. The Rulemaking Calendar will be reproduced for publication exactly as received, so it is important to send us a final document. Please remember to fill in your agency name in the top heading on the form.

Completed Schedules A or B received by OAL after February 1, 2025 may not appear in the 2024 Rulemaking Calendar as published in the California Regulatory Notice Register and posted on our website.
